

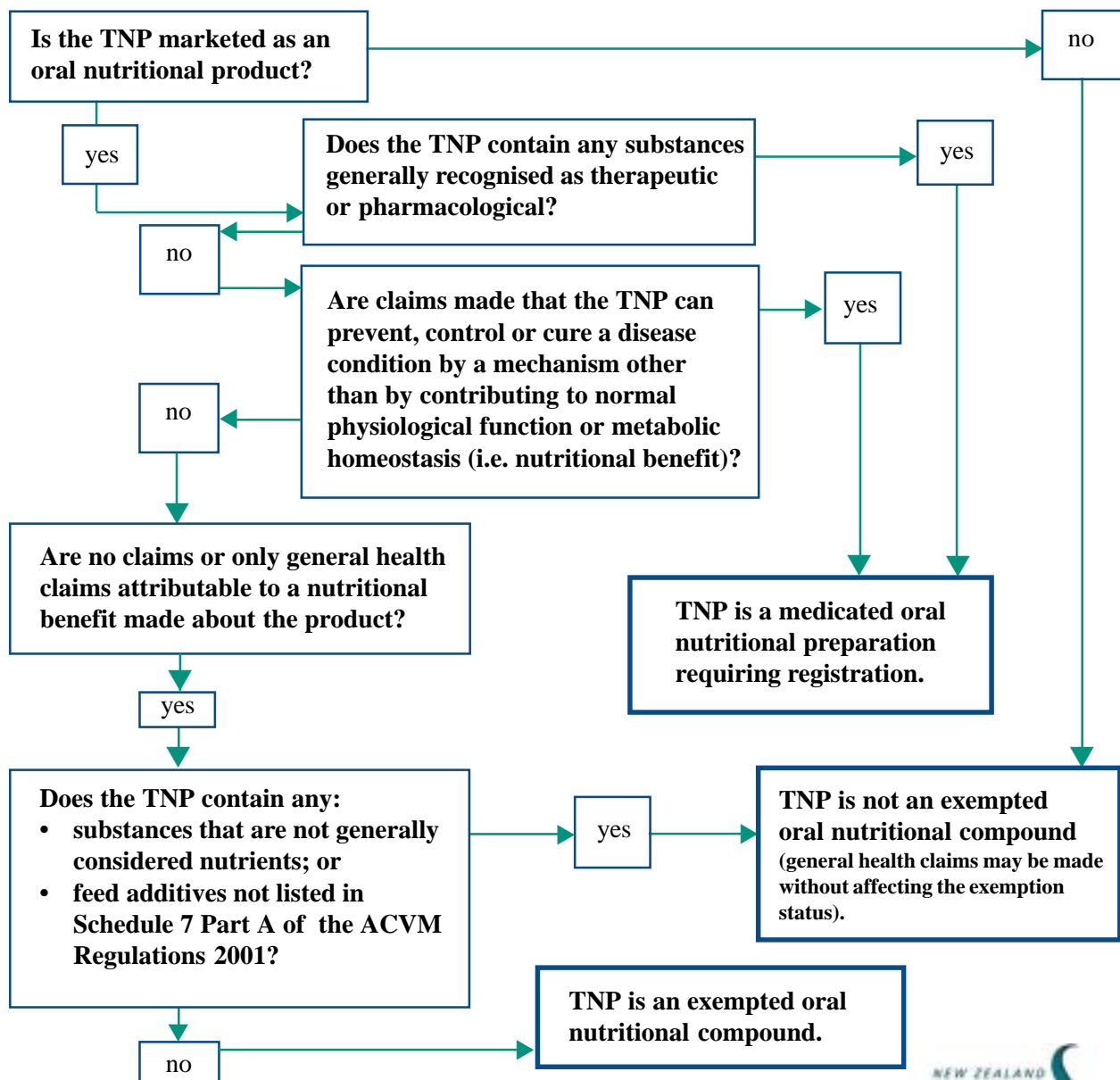
ACVM Group info on:

oral nutritional compound group of exempted trade name products – definition clarification

To be considered an oral nutritional compound exempt from registration, a trade name product (TNP) must **not**:

- be medicated, i.e. contain any substances that are generally accepted to be therapeutic or pharmacological, except in a nutritional context;
- contain any feed additive that is not listed in Schedule 7 Part A of the Agricultural Compounds and Veterinary Medicines (ACVM) Regulations 2001;
- make any therapeutic or pharmacological claims other than general health claims attributable to a nutritional benefit;
- contain any substance of uncertain status as either a nutrient or feed additive;
- use any slow release mechanism containing high/concentrated levels of substances.
